TO HELP DENVER-AREA CHILDREN SUCCEED IN SCHOOL**

*National Backpack Program Celebrates 10th Anniversary;
More Than 2.3 Million Backpacks Given Away Since 2001*

Glendale, Colo., August 10, 2010 – What weighs as much as seven blue whales, stands taller than 10,000 giraffes, stretches from Denver to Kansas City – and gives children hope? The answer is 2.3 million backpacks, of course, which happens to be the number of backpacks that the Office Depot Foundation has given away to deserving children since it established its National Backpack Program 10 years ago.

On Wednesday, August 11, the Office Depot Foundation will donate more than 2,000 backpacks containing essential school supplies to children served by non-profit organizations and schools in the Denver area. The Foundation, which serves as the independent charitable giving arm of Office Depot® (NYSE:ODP), will present the backpacks during a special “Back-to-School Backpack Celebration” beginning at 2 p.m. at the Office Depot store located at 770 South Colorado Blvd. in Glendale.

This year, the Office Depot Foundation is celebrating the 10th anniversary of its National Backpack Program. “Every year, we have seen our backpacks bring hope to children whose families might not be able to afford to buy them a new backpack,” says Mary Wong, president of the Office Depot Foundation. “Parents and teachers alike tell us that we truly are helping children to build self-confidence, boost self-esteem and achieve greater success in the classroom – all as a result of being properly prepared for school.”

Special guests scheduled to participate in the backpack presentations include Paula Bovo from the Glendale City Council, representing Mayor Larry Harte; Bennie Milliner, representing US Senator Michael Bennet; and Deborah Parsons, District Outreach and Federal Grants Manager, representing Congresswoman Diana DeGette.

The non-profit organizations, schools and agencies scheduled to receive backpacks during the August 11 donation event include:

To distribute the backpacks in 2010, the Foundation is hosting 25 “Back-to-School Backpack Celebrations” in cities across the U.S. and Canada – five of which will include Tony Stewart, driver of the No. 14 Office Depot/Old Spice Chevy Impala in the NASCAR Sprint Cup Series™. Thousands of backpacks also are being donated by Office Depot stores in hundreds of local communities and in collaboration with Office Depot’s Business Solutions Division in select cities.

Thousands more backpacks are being given to children through the Office Depot Foundation’s partnerships with national non-profit organizations – including the Tony Stewart Foundation, the National Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) Association, Community Anti-Drug Coalitions of America (CADCA), Feed The Children, the Kids In Need Foundation, Nourish America, Zach Bonner’s Little Red Wagon Foundation and the National Foundation for Women Legislators, whose members once again will donate backpacks in all 50 states. For the third consecutive year, backpack donations will be made to children of the Navajo Nation in Arizona and the Rosebud Sioux Tribe in South Dakota.
